

# Letter Sound File Folder Games

File folder games are fun, education and easy to store, making them ideal for homeschooling. Cardboard file folders are used as the base for the games. Nearly any educational concept works with a file folder game. For letters sounds, open up the file folder and glue various letters to the inside of the file folder.

## Games to Play with the File Folder







### Match It
















Print several pictures of items that start with the different letters. The kids place each item next to its corresponding letter on the file folder.

### Follow the Letter Trail

Another idea is to place the letters in a game map trail. Add a pair of dice and any small object to create an instant board game. The child rolls the dice and moves the marker however many spaces. Whatever letter he lands on, he must say the sound of that letter or go back to the spot he was last in. The first person to reach the end of the trail wins the game.

See if you can invent a few games of your own. Print out the letters and pictures below on heavy card stock. Cut out each square and separate the letters and pictures. Glue the letters in a trail-like pattern on the inside of you file folder. Allow to dry completely. Place a rubber band around the pictures and place inside the file folder.
